
Time: 9:00am - app. 12:30pm (end time takes into account course play)

FAIRWAY AND GREEN'S REPORT

The holidays are behind us and so is the first month of 2017. What a month it was, with record rainfall and snowfall, it looks like Nor Cal is in good shape water wise. Speaking of water, I want to throw some figures at you regarding our water use.

We've been on a self-imposed mission since 2013 to conserve water. Case in point, in 2013, we used 3,938,500 cubic feet of water. A cubic foot of water is 7.48 gallons. In 2014, Bill and Scott, (CourseCo. V.P. of Agronomy), came up with an irrigation plan to conserve water and we used only 3,142,500 cubic feet that year. The water department imposed restrictions in Petaluma in 2015 and used 2013 as its baseline for a 20%

reduction. We submitted a plan to address severe reductions if they were imposed and the water dept. said that we were good with what we're doing and the plan we have in place. Of course with less irrigation, there's more brown on the course and this was impacting some areas, especially the right side of #9 fairway, past the hazard and up to the green. If you hit a shot on that right side with some right hand spin to it, it most likely would go O.B. into the range. So in 2015, we turned on a line of sprinklers on that right side that had been turned off. We changed them from full circles to half circles and that helped keep balls in bounds, that shouldn't have gone O.B. Along with turning on some sprinklers in other areas that had been turned off in 2014, it did increase our water out put in 2015 to 3,398,140 cubic ft.

So, at the end of 2015, we had a \$500 per member assessment to upgrade our almost 30yr. old irrigation system and put a new roof on the clubhouse. We purchased and had installed in the first quarter of 2016, a central radio satellite controlled computer system, which included 13 new control boxes. Irrigation times are programmed into the computer, the course is irrigated and a report on the irrigation is documented so that when Bill comes in the next morning, he can read the report and do a visual of the course to make adjustments for the next night's irrigation. This is just a thumbnail sketch of what the system can do. A huge improvement over the prior system, where someone had to go to each control box and set timers.

This, along with completing the conversion and installation of our sprinklers to a more efficient model, (465 in total over 12-15yrs., the last 108 we bought and had installed in Feb. 2016), has given Bill the ability to irrigate the course and get more water on the course in less time. He and the CourseCo guys are still learning how to maximize the efficiencies and 2017 should be even better and more efficient than 2016. Many members, in 2016, thought the course was in its best condition ever and I agree. We even used 60,000 less cubic ft. in 2016 than 2015. We would have saved even more because when we finished converting the last 108 sprinklers we kept them on. We had heavy water usage in June and July in 2016 over 2015 and so we ended up turning off about 90 sprinklers and got back on track in August. Once again in September, we used more water than in past Septembers but this was due to making sure the course was in great shape for the club championships and Goat hill tournaments that were both played that month. A rate increase took effect in June and even with all that, in 2016, we paid \$136,951.05 for water which included \$5,343.12 for sewer and \$632.64 in service charges. In 2015, we paid \$143,262.71 which included \$5,134.08 in sewer and \$616.68 in service charges. Since 2013 there has been a 28% increase in water rates and we expect another 6% rate increase in 2017. We are projecting a 2% decrease in our 2017 usage from 2016.

A footnote, when Russ Mitchell, (irrigation architect expert), gave his assessment of our irrigation system in Sept. 2015 which prompted our upgrades, he listed 5 areas we needed to upgrade. With the new computer controlled system and converting the sprinklers, we've done the first 2. The computer, satellites and controllers were done with the assessment. The cost was \$96,000 and included labor. The conversion of the sprinklers is harder to put a number on because the prices have increased over the years. I'll tell you that we've done this through our CIDM funding and we we're able to purchase the last 120 sprinklers in Jan. 2016 at a huge bulk rate, (end of the year, 2015), discount. It cost us \$21,500 for the sprinklers and another \$7,500 to have them installed. We were buying them at one or two boxes at a time for \$2,000 a box. A box contains 8 sprinklers and fittings. The 3rd thing Mr. Mitchell said was we need to re-wire all of our sprinklers individually so that we could have the ability to turn one off or on as needed. Presently, they are wired in groups of 2, 3 and 4, so if you wanted to turn one off, you'd have to do it manually at the sprinkler. He estimated that by doing this along with the first two improvements, in years of normal water usage, we would save 18-22%. This has an associated cost of \$71,500 and that was a 2015 price. Our plan for now is to monitor areas for dryness or wetness and individually wire where needed. We did this in 2016 and will do the same in 2017. We are however, planning this year in May, to do his 4th suggestion, which is to add sprinklers around the greens and separate them so that certain sprinklers will water the greens and the other ones will water the surrounds. Right now, all green side sprinklers water both greens and surrounds putting too much water in those areas.

Now I'd like to inform you of what we spent our CIDM money on in 2016. We spent a total of \$62,240.78, (which includes a \$2,000 rebate). Our budget was \$56,706. \$28,631.58 in equipment leases & the Exchange Bank loan. In addition: House and Grounds also paid an additional \$8,041.68 for their share of the Exchange Bank loan. In the Spring of 2013 we took out a \$70,000 loan to purchase 5 badly needed pieces of equipment and it was agreed at the time, that H&G and Greens would split the cost.

- \$3,200 for the removal of 3 trees to the right of #5 green. One tree fell over the fence and the two next to it were leaning towards the green and deemed a potential hazard.
- \$21,823.20 for the above mentioned 120 sprinklers.
- \$7,236.00 for the installation of 108 sprinklers.
- \$600 for the delivery of sand.
- \$1,750.40 for sod with which we rebuilt the #8/17 tee with in-house labor.
- \$1,000 for landscaping
- Total: \$64,240.78

If you deduct the \$28,631.58, we spent on equip. leases, we spent \$35,609.20 on projects of which, \$29,059.20 was spent on sprinklers and installation.

So my committee asked the board to shift equipment leases out of CIDM and into operating expenses in 2017. The board agreed to shift \$22,748.88 for the 3 equip. leases we have out of CIDM into operating but keep the Exchange Bank loan in CIDM. This will give Greens and H&G about an additional \$11,000 each to do projects. We are also now on an equipment replacement schedule and our next piece of equipment we will buy is in 2018 when the Exchange Bank loan comes off the books.

In order to accomplish this, we had to raise dues \$20 per month to cover the change and we did approve a balanced budget for 2017. On behalf of the Greens Committee, I would like to thank the membership for their understanding and let everyone know that the money will be put to good use.

We are presently cart path only at the time of this writing. It may change by the time you read this but if it doesn't, for your safety and the safety of the course, please abide by the rule.
