Fairways and Greens Report

On behalf of the Green Committee, I would like to thank those of you who volunteered to work and help with our Spring aeration on Monday March 28th. It was a huge help for our Fairway's crew. Aeration is always a very heavy labor-intensive day and the crew really appreciates the help.

On May 9th, the 'single head irrigation' project will begin. In bullet point form, I'm going to outline the history of our irrigation system, what the Green Committee has done and will be doing to bring our irrigation system up to the 'industry standard' and what we are researching and potentially planning to reduce irrigation needs.

1989: PGCC members vote to assess themselves \$500 to install an irrigation system. They would receive the \$500 back when they resigned from the Club and their membership was sold. This was done to replace hoses with attached sprinklers which were used to irrigate the course. If you had played PGCC before then, then you know the poor conditions that existed. Russ Mitchell, (Irrigation Architect), was hired to lay out the system. Due to the costs, his suggestion of wiring each sprinkler individually and running the wire to the control boxes, where they would then be spliced into groups of 2, 3's & 4's and connected to the boxes was nixed by the 1989 board as being too costly. So the wires were run individually from the sprinklers to the valves and spliced there in groups of 2, 3's & 4's. Then 1 wire was run from the valves and connected to the control boxes. The results were that sprinklers came on in 2's 3's & 4's which has led to 33 years of inefficient irrigation, leaving wet & dry areas.

2012: Green Committee contracts with CourseCo to have their V.P. of Agronomy assist Head Supt. Bill Maeder in devising & implementing an agronomy plan which included the science, industry practices & necessary equipment to accomplish the plan along with monthly site visits. Up to then, Bill had minimal support in these areas.

2013: PGCC contracts with CourseCo to manage Club which includes the above plus their National Discount on equipment.

Sept. 2015: Green Committee hires Russ Mitchell to assess our irrigation system. Mitchell makes 5 suggestions:

1. Replace control system with new computerized central control & radio linked satellite controllers: This was done in 2016 through a board approved \$500 assessment. Part of this assessment was used to put a new roof on the clubhouse.
2. Replace approximately 160 existing outdated sprinklers. This was done in 2016 through the assessment and the Green Committees ongoing 'sprinkler replacement' project which was/is funded by CIDM.
3. Install new individual control wire from the valves into the control boxes for single sprinkler control. This is what we are starting on May 9th. It will be done through our CIDM.
4. Add a 2nd sprinkler at each green side sprinkler to separate irrigation of greens & surrounds. We did this in 2018 through our CIDM.
5. Replace existing isolation valves, (there are 100 hundred of them). It was very

expensive and we decided to replace them as needed.

Years 2016 through 2021 we were attempting to complete the 'cart path' project which began in the early 2000's. This entailed completing the concreting of the paths from behind the 6th green through the rest of the course. We were able to finally finish this project in Oct. 2021.

June 2021: PGCC voluntarily implemented a 25% reduction in irrigation.

July 2021: City of Petaluma mandated that we reduce our irrigation by 25% using July 2020 as the baseline. We were already in compliance.

July 2021: A miscommunication from a city official mandated that we only irrigate 2 days per week, Mondays & Thursdays and only use 180,000 gallons each day. This allowed us to irrigate only the tees & greens.

July 2021: After a protracted period of days, CourseCo was finally able to get a meeting with the head of the City Public Works Department and got us back onto the 25% of the previous year's amount, which was carried on through August, Sept. & Oct. Unfortunately, during the time that we were restricted to Mondays & Thursdays, the fairways & roughs were lost and didn't come back until after our historic rain in Oct.

Summer of 2021: The board sent out a survey to the members asking for the prioritizing of projects they would like to see done at the Club. Irrigation & golf course improvements were not on the list. Members #1 project was the renovation of the swimming pool. As a board member at the time, this was also my #1 project. It is going to be very expensive but I personally believe it will greatly benefit the members and our club.

Fall of 2021: I presented to the board, The Green Committee's recommendation to individualize our sprinkler system, (#3 suggestion by Russ Mitchell in 2015). It was approved.

Bill, Russ Mitchell & Gary Ingram, (Sr. Agronomist for CourseCo), got together and reviewed our course sprinkler irrigation map. They ascertained which sprinklers that were in use at the time, & which could be turned off to reduce costs. The information was submitted to PAR which is the company that did the irrigation installation work in 2016 & 2018.

Fall of 2021: The Green Committee started looking into the feasibility of bermuda grass. This is a grass that once it takes hold, doesn't need a lot of water and holds up well in the heat. Gary Ingram did research for us and Tom Isaak set up a meeting with the Head Supt. at JFK, (a CourseCo managed property), in Napa. They have a test area of several different varieties of bermuda. We looked at which ones might be something we could do a test with.

Dec. 2021: Members of the Club & Green Committee went to Chuck Corrica Golf Courses in Alameda and played the North Course. This course had been renovated a few years ago and the fairways were sodded with bermuda. The South Course is presently undergoing the same type of renovation. Gary set up a presentation by Marc Logan of Greenways Golf. This was the company that did the renovation.

Three methods are used, new sod, (very expensive), seed, (drawback is it doesn't always grow in uniformly), stolonizing, (broadcast sprigging of vegetative planting material uniformly deposited on moist, not wet soil surface. For us, Marc would use the Stolons technique. \$6,000 per acre and we would do it on one of the fairways that we are putting in the single head irrigation. The problem is it needs a lot of irrigation the first few weeks and with water restrictions, it's not feasible at this time.

Dec. 2021: PAR gave us a bid for \$175,000 to do the entire course & this was presented by me to the board. The board wanted to wait until Mark Smith, (Chair of H&G), presented the Landscape Architects drawings/costs for the pool renovation which was to be the 1st week of Jan. Feb. 2022: I asked Bill for an alternate plan, (3 highest

priority holes), on the ‘single head’ irrigation project and to get a price. It was agreed we do #1, 3 & 9. The price is \$85,000.

Feb. 2022: Mark was finally able to get the info from the Landscape Architect & make his presentation at the Feb. B.o.D. mtg. I also presented my alternate plan of doing #1, 3 & 9. This would be paid out of our CIDM, with \$40,000 coming out of our accrued to date CIDM & borrowing \$45,000 from the Club to be paid back at \$3,000 per mo. over 15 months. The board approved.

March 24th, 2022: Travis was contacted by City Public Works and told we can expect restrictions of 25-30% of last year’s monthly allotments and that it is most likely to start earlier than last year’s July start.

Presently, the board is deciding on whether to do a ‘good faith’ voluntary reduction of 10% before restrictions are imposed.

Several years ago CourseCo came up with an ‘irrigation restriction plan’: 20%: no change to tees, fairways & greens: 15% reduction in roughs, 100% in out of play/ range. 25%: no change to tees & greens. 15% reduction to fairways, 25% roughs. 50%: no change to tees & greens. 50% reduction to fairways, 100% roughs. More than 50%: no change to tees & greens. 75-100% reduction to fairways, 100% everything else, or put a ‘For Sale’ sign up.

May 9th 2022: The ‘single head’ irrigation project for hole #1, 3 & 9 will commence.

PG&CC History – Part 23

Play Continues 22

The annual meeting was held on Thursday, March 27, 1941, following supper at the club. Committee reports were received and films of professional golfers were presented by Stanley Seidell. On the course, grass seed planted in the fall was nurtured by heavy winter rains. With the use of the new sprinkler system and well, the course was expected to stay green throughout the summer season for the first time.

The first tournament of the year was the seventh annual 72-hole Argus Courier tournament. After the first round, Walt Rossi led with a gross 74 for a net 68. Rossi continued to lead after the second round with a net 137, followed by 1939’s winner, Bob Winfield with a net 139. Winfield took a one stroke lead over Rossi in the third round and went on to win in the fourth round with a 4-round net of 278.

Next up on Sunday, May 11, was the qualifying round for 16 positions in the 72-hole Maclay Cup tournament. Defending champion and club captain John Moskowitz shot an 81 with a 15 handicap for a net 66. The highlight of Moskowitz’s round was an eagle on the 475-yard 9th hole with a drive, 5 iron and a putt. The barbeque and Calcutta Pool auction of players was held on Sunday, May 18. In a first round upset, Moskowitz lost to “Tiny” Baker. The second round highlight was a hole-in-one by Bob Winfield. Carl Behrens defeated George Tilden in the 36-hole final 1 up.

On Monday, July 14, 1941, popular pro Sandy Leith was injured in an automobile accident in Marin County and died the following day at Marin General Hospital. Leith was replaced by Jack Neville who had 20 plus years of experience in the industry and most recently worked at Northwood. Neville famously had also helped in laying out and in the construction of Pebble Beach Golf Course and was also a five-time California amateur champion.

After playing the club championship in the spring every year since the first one in 1925, a second club championship was scheduled for September. The second championship was touted as an alternative to the wet and stormy conditions in the spring for the sake of better weather in the fall now that the new sprinkler system was keeping the course green year-round. Defending two-time club champion Bill Vartnaw went down in the quarter finals to Frank Studdert Jr. In the semi-finals, Walt Rossi beat Carl Behrens 2 and 1 while Frank Studdert Jr. defeated Roy Saunders 4 and 3. Studdert was the 1937 champion and Rossi defeated him in 1938 and went on to retain the title in 1939. Studdert reached the title round in 1940, but lost to Bill Vartnaw. In the hotly contested 36-hole final on Sunday, September 28, both players shot 72's in the first 18 holes leaving Rossi 2 holes up. In the afternoon round, Rossi won five holes in the first nine to go 6 up. Wins on the 28th and 29th holes gave Rossi his third club championship.

On Sunday, October 12, the Argus Courier sponsored a hole-in-one contest for the public. Local merchants donated more than 30 prizes to be awarded to the highest scoring golfers in each of eight categories. A temporary tee was set up in the area of the current fifth green and each player had five shots to the former 6th green that was in the middle of what's now the fifth hole fairway. The pin was set up like a target with rings at 3-foot, 8-foot and 15-foot distances with point values of 5, 3, and 2 respectively and a hole in one worth 10. Players were given 5 shots and those with the highest points were winners in their division. The winner of the championship flight was Bob Winfield, organizer of the event, with the closet shot of the day, at five feet, two inches. Better results might have been expected, but the day was marred by high winds and rain before it could be completed.

Junior Golf

Spring is here, and the **2022 season of PG&CC Junior Golf is ramping up!** On March 13, Golf Pro Patrick Steiner kicked off the 2022 Junior Golf season with an Orientation Event for nearly 50 interested Junior golf participants and their parents/grandparents. Patrick provided handouts to all attendees, then presented all aspects of the 2022 PG&CC Junior Golf Program in detail, and answered all questions asked by attendees. Here's the summary:

- **Junior Golf Camps (3):** Intended for beginners, ages 6-12. Each of the 3 camps are 3 half-days, from 8am to 12pm. Dates are June 21-23; July 12-14; Aug. 2-4. Contact Golf Pro Patrick Steiner to sign-up.
- **PGA Junior Golf League:** Team match competitions with other Sonoma County golf course teams (ages 8-13). Format is two 2-person teams playing Scramble matches for 9-holes. Scoring is in 3-hole increments.
- **North Bay Junior Golf League:** Advanced Team competition tournaments and Championship for juniors 14-17 years old.
- **Junior Golf Lessons:** Range from junior golf clinics, private lessons, group lessons, and customized lessons.
- **PG&CC Junior Golf Championship Tournament:** Will be on August 14th. Will consist of several flights + Championship Flight.

Status to-date:

- **Junior Golf Practice and Matches:** Patrick plans to begin junior golf team practices on Wednesday, April 20th or 27th, and continue every Wednesday throughout the Junior Golf Season of May, June, and July. Team members will be notified via TeamSnap emails and team postings.
- **PGA Jr. League:** There are currently 16 players registered in PGAJL. Registration was extended to **April 9th** and will close on that date. Currently registered PGAJL Team members are Jack Hatcher, Brooke Hatcher, Jackilynn Regan-Tucker, Mae Stearns, Jason Rangoussis, Javier Alonso, Mike Costello, Carson Roemer, Owen Roemer, Phoenix Ciampi, Benny Archer, Avery McGaughey, Carter Kelly-Cuisimano, Colton Savage, Cash Evans-Reber, Johnny Baxman, and Max Baxman.
- **North Bay Junior Golf League:** The Team includes the following returning members: (Boys) Scott Regan-Tucker, Aiden Smith, Chase Mandel, Nicolas Anxolabehere, and Spencer Madson-Castillo; (Girls) Emily Poehlmann, Zoe Gaidmore, and Cara Broadhead. Patrick will continue to recruit additional team members during April, and expects to form a team of 10 or more boys & girls. **Contact Patrick NOW if interested in qualifying for the NBJGL Team.** Practice will begin in late April and continue through July.

Then five qualifying NBJGL Team tournaments are scheduled as follows: Wed., June 15th @ Santa Rosa G&CC; Mon. June 27th @ Petaluma G&CC; Wed. July 13th @ Windsor GC; Tues. July 19th @ Rooster Run GC; Wed. July 27th @ The Fountaingrove Club; Team Championship on Wed. Aug. 3rd @ TBD.

Individual Championship Matches begin week of Aug. 7th @ Windsor GC; elimination matches continue thru August based on Brackets.

PG&CC JUNIOR GOLF DEVELOPMENT (a 501c3 non-profit organization):

Jr. Golf Development Projects Update: Junior Golf Development has assisted the Greens Committee and Golf Pro with planning and partial funding for the following junior golf projects that are underway or nearly completed:

- Driving Range extended level platform with hitting mats and range ball trays is near completion (new grass leading to the platform in place).
- New Junior/Senior Tee Box on hole #5 has turf installed and should be ready for play within 30 days. (New Jr./Sr. Tee on #9 and leveling/new grass on all other Jr. Tees expected soon.). Once completed, JGD will assist Golf Pro and Greens Committee in having NCGA officially rate new Junior/Senior Tees as a new PG&CC Combo set of tees.
- Planning is underway to add a hitting net for long range irons and drivers.

Fundraising Update for PG&CC Jr. Golf Development:

- **Quarter 1, 2022 Donations:** **\$7,285** in tax-deductible donations was received. This is in addition to 2021 total of **\$12,575**.
- **JGD fundraising to-date** has been primarily by word-of-mouth. However, the JGD Board is planning a more formal fundraising capital campaign in the next month or so. Stay tuned and watch for its Announcement!
- **JGD Plans:** Projects under consideration include: acquisition of technological golf training materials; subsidizing some training and program costs for juniors; subsidizing juniors' access to targeted golf clinics. If any member has additional suggestions for junior golf projects, please submit them to Golf Pro Patrick. He proposes and evaluates all JGD projects.

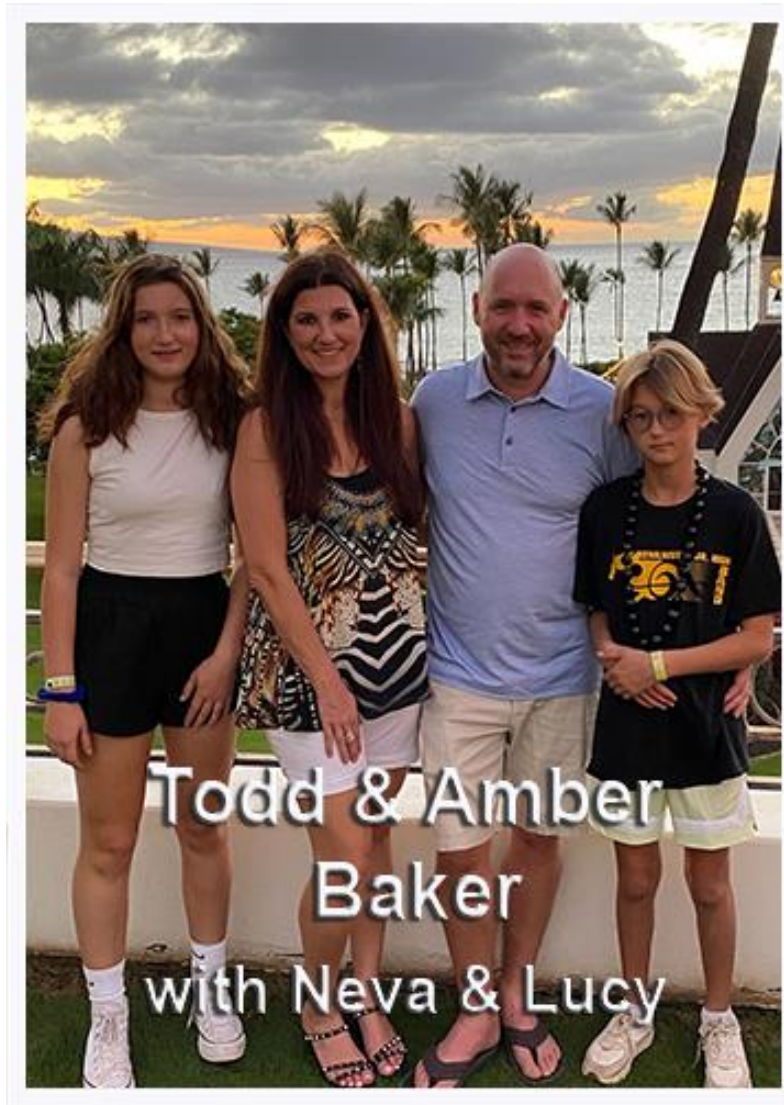


New Member Corner
